

"Dobbsie" Leads Radio Star Revue at Calif. State Fair

Everybody happy? You've got to be, to get a seat in the grandstand at the California Diamond Jubilee State Fair the afternoon of September 1st, for it will be "Happytime Day" with Hugh Barrett Dobbs, popular radio star, as master of ceremonies.

Twenty-nine other radio celebrities will appear with "Dobbsie" on the big platform in front of the grandstand in a two-hour program during which the forces of joy, cheer and happiness will completely rout gloom pessimism and all their synonyms.

Loud speakers will be scattered through the stands, and groups of radio sets will be installed so the Happytimers can hear as well as see all that is going on.

"Dobbsie" and his cohort, "Wee Willie" Hancock, captain and first mate of the Ship of Joy are well known to radio listeners of the Pacific Coast.

Miss Marian Dozier, concert soprano of nationwide renown will be among the other artists on the afternoon program. She sings as a little Dutch girl, Fraulein Griefchen.

And there'll be Richard (Dick) Jose who started his professional career in Sacramento 18 years ago and first introduced the immortal songs, "Silver Threads Among the Gold," and "When You and I Were Young, Maggie." Jose, now 67 years of age, began his career with Reeves' minstrel show. On the stage at a Philadelphia theater some years ago he met with a serious accident and it was not until recently when radio presented the opportunity that he resumed singing publicly. He is said to hold the record for radio "fan mail" west of the Rockies, receiving nearly ten times as much as any other star on the west coast.

Charles Kellogg, "the bird man," Sambo and Ed, William Powers and many other radio personalities will be presented on the Happytime program.

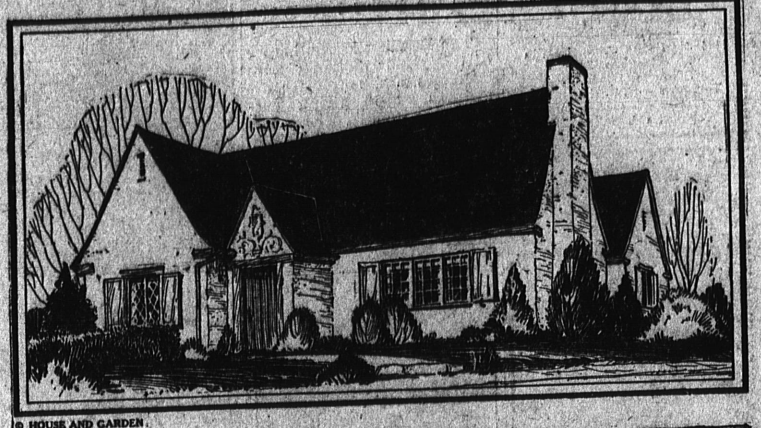

A One Story Stucco House



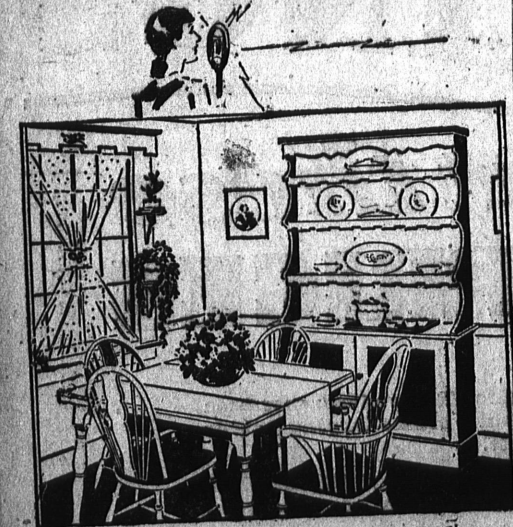
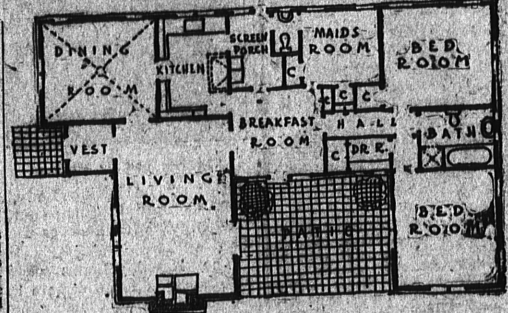
While the plan of the small house above is rather unusual, it is certainly practical and, as all rooms are on one floor level, it proved quite economical as to building costs. The main body of the house is long and narrow, with two wings jutting out at right angles. The space between these wings has been tiled and is used as a patio.

The entrance vestibule is located in a small gable of its own, alongside the dining room. Directly behind the vestibule is the living room which opens into dining room and breakfast room and out to the patio. This living room is a well-proportioned chamber with windows on two sides and a fireplace in the end wall between. On the opposite side of the patio is a bedroom and separated from this room by a bath is another bedroom.

The breakfast room acts as a sort of central hall and from it the kitchen, living room, maid's bedroom and a hall leading to the two master bedrooms may be reached.

Tan stucco surfaces the exterior of this house and a roof of shingles in variegated colorings provides an excellent contrast. A decorative cartouche above the entrance doorway adds an interesting touch to the facade.
