Safeway Sales Increase 102%; Big Vegetable Dock Is Built

Showing an increase in sales of 102% for the first eight months of 1929 over the same period last year, the national system of Safeway Stores has achieved a sales record unparalleled in the history of any large business in the country. This statement was made yesterday by Vice President Edward Dale, executive head of the Southern California division of Safeway Stores, just prior to his departure for Chicago to attend the annual convention of the National Chain Stores Association, of which he is also vice president.

"From present indications," said Mr. Dale, "Safeway Stores sales for 1929, the quota for which had been set at \$180,000,000, will exceed those figures by approximately 20%. The Safeway system, with units distributed throughout the United States and in certain sections of Canada, now numbers 2600 store units and 1090 meat markets. In Southern California the company operates 700 store units and 360 meat markets, under direct supervision of the Los Angeles executives offices. In the Canadian field the company has embarked on an elaborate building campaign, housing all its units in modern buildings constructed from specifications prepared by our own engineers."

Mr. Dale announced that the new \$250,000 steel and concrete fruit and vegetable dock, now in course of construction adjoining the Los Angeles plant, will be placed in operation the first of November. This dock, the largest yet to be constructed in the United States, will embrace 48,000 square feet of platform space with trackage capable of accommodating 22 carloads of fruits and vegetables at one time. Every mechanical device necessary for the quick handling of arriving and departing cars will be installed. California-grown fresh fruits and vegetables will be shipped daily to the Safeway Store units distributed over the western half of the United States, Canada and to Washington, D. C. The basement, embracing as much floor space as the dock platform itself, will house a huge refrigerating plant in which all perishable merchandise will be placed awaiting shipment.

The recent warm weather has kept the new ice cream plant and creamery in full operation 24 hours daily. During the coming winter season this plant is to be further enlarged in order to take care of constantly increasing milk and ice cream orders coming from within the Safeway organization, Mr. Dale said.

SCREEN GRID EXPLAINED BY SARGEANT

With screen grid tubes this entire problem of distortion together with the balancing of radio sets, etc., passes into history.

3. Long aerials are no longer necessary for distance reception.
4. Screen grid tubes must be used in circuits properly designed to control their power and sensitivity. Such a circuit is found in the Crosley and with it stations far away may be picked up and enjoyed free of interference despite the fact that there is but ten kilocycles difference in the wave length between the far away station and the station nearby. Greater selectivity than that in any radio would be useless."

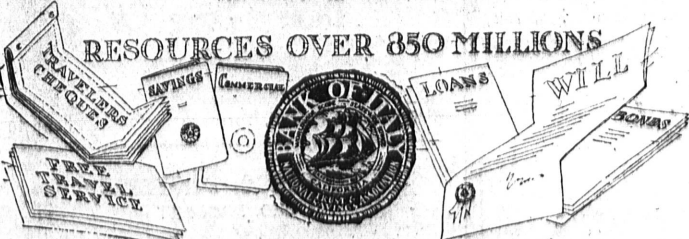

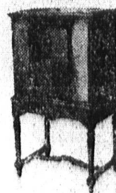
