Gentlemen:-
Under date of October 14th, 1929, we addressed letter to you discussing the Torrance water situation Since that date we have made a further study looking rance and have also undertaken an investigation the practicability of the city of Torrance building an entirely new system with the thought that this study would be of assistance to your water cominittee in the preparation of its report. This report we understand was to follow the outline suggested for investigation by the Chamber of Commerce resolution of July 15th We understand, however, that the Committee has al ready presented a preliminary report to you, which report does not deal, except in a casual way, with th question of the physical condition and worth of the present properties of the Torrance Water, Light and Power company. The thas "i thorough analysi Chamber of Commerce was that horough an the present properties of the Torrance Water, Light and Power Compiany, if it is considered advisable to acquir this system as a part of the projected municipal deve opment;" be made. We believe that this point should be investigated to determine the advisability of acqui tion of this system as against the proposal to bund believe that any defintribution systendan can be mad either, way cuntil this point has been investigated
We have had made by the Loveland Engineers, Inc study of the probable cost to the City or of supply and starage facilities, also of the cost of operation of such a system by the City. This was undertaken with knowledge of the fact that your Committee wa haking a similar investigation and the report, whic losed been completed and a copy of which is reached both as to operation and cost. Briefly, the report submitted by the Loveland Engineers, Inc the City will be approximately $\$ 500,000.00$, requiring a bond issue of this amount. The analysis of Expense and Revenues to be derived on the basis of the presen rates charged by the Tordance, Water, Light and Powe
Company shows an insufficient balance available to provide for interest payments on a bond issue of thi amount and for amortization of the bonds. It is there fore evident that it would be impossible for the cit oo build a new system wise uncess charges is permitte to fall upon the property owners through increased texes instead of upon the water consumers where properly belongs
Another important factor to consider is the seriou inconvenieace and loss of business which would be ex
erienced by your local business people, as well as the inconvenience by your local citizens occasioned by torn up paving throughout the city for months during the per lod of construction of a new' system
We would like to point out that there is consider made of the possibility of securing an adequate suppl of good water for the present and future needs ore, the attempted development of such a supply volves a considerable financial risk either to the Ci
the Torrance water, Lignt anu rower company,

There has been some discussion at varoous time as to the conditions of the mains of the Torrance Water, Light and Power Company, and during the ection of our lines in order to examine its condition This section was removed under the observation of the Loveland Engineers, Inc., and a chemist from Smith Emery Company.
