

The Golden Text consisted of Paul's inspiring words to the Corinthians: "We that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened: not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be swallowed up of life."

A scriptural passage in the Lesson-Sermon contained John's statement: "We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brethren, he that loveth not his brother abideth in death"; and another passage cited Paul's strong exhortation "For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality."

A selection from the Christian Science textbook, "Eddy, contained by Mary Baker Eddy, contained the words: "Mortals must gravitate Godward, their affections and aims grow spiritual,—they must near the broader interpretations of being, and gain some proper view of the infinite,—in that sin and mortality may be put off."

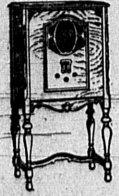
