THE CARE OF CUT FLOWERS
 Cut flowers, when properly treated, can be kept fresh for two to three weeks. Every night take them out of the water and thoroughly rinse the stalks, removing decomposed matter. Put them into a basin of strong soapsuds, but do not allow any water to touch the flowers. In the morning rinse the stalks in the water again, and, as each blossom is arranged in a vase of fresh water, cut off a small portion of the stem, for each day the pores are closed by congealing sap and a fresh cut allows water free access to the stem.

"Beware of auto thieves for this is their big season."
 Such is, in effect, the warning being broadcast to motorists by the theft bureau of the Automobile Club of Southern California against the expectation of a large influx of thieves from the east and an increase in thefts, as a result of license renewals.

One of the first acts of every motorist after obtaining his 1930 license plates for the car should be to jot down the number on some thing that will always be at hand, advises this organization. The auto license renewal period for 1930 starts December 15th and many thousands of plates will be distributed within the first few weeks. The state Division of Motor Vehicles at Sacramento is naturally swamped with applications and records during this time so that they are generally several weeks behind in the filing. Auto thieves in previous years have taken advantage of this situation and when the victim autoist does not know the new license number on his stolen car the police and detective agencies such as the auto club theft bureau are seriously handicapped in trying to recover it. It is extremely difficult to obtain the record from the state motor vehicle offices, which issues some two million licenses during this period.

Governor Says "Be Careful at Christmas Time"

Look out for Christmas shoppers!

Citing the fact that the business sections of every city and town in California will be filled with gift shoppers during the next two weeks Governor C. C. Young today urged motorists to drive with especial care in shopping districts.

Governor Young said: "We are approaching a season of happiness, peace, and good will; a season when we lay aside our cares and devote much of our thought to the exchange of gifts in token of our affection for each other."
 "Our streets are filled with people busily engaged in the task of Christmas shopping, often oblivious to traffic conditions surrounding them. Under such conditions, mishaps at intersections are likely to occur unless the motorist is constantly on the alert."
 "While the responsibility is not all with the motorists, it is better that he make allowances for pedestrians, possibly loaded down with packages, or intent on the hunt for suitable gifts. Records of accidents compiled by the state show that pedestrian accidents are always high in December."
 "I urge every person driving a motor vehicle to use extreme care during this period, lest the spirit of holiday joy be turned into one of tragedy. I urge the co-operation of all municipal traffic authorities in averting such accidents."
