Recipes

CHRISTMAS SALADS

Apple-O Salad Peel and slice oranges, rejecting all white membrane. Cut wedge-shaped slices from red apples, without paring. Arrange on lettuce-covered salad plates, using alternate slices of orange and apple.

Centered Circle Peel orange and grapefruit and divide into segments, rejecting all white skin. Arrange a circle of orange segments on a lettuce-covered salad plate and fill center with grapefruit segments.

GIANT APPLE SUPREME

1 package vanilla junket 1 pint milk 6 apples 1 cup sugar 1-2 cup water 2 tablespoons red cinnamon candies 1 tablespoon lemon juice Peel and core apples and place in baking pan. Make a syrup by boiling the sugar, water and cinnamon candies together for five minutes; add slightly thickened syrup over apples and bake until tender, basting several times. Place apples in individual dishes, adding a little syrup. When cooled and the syrup has jellied, prepare vanilla junket according to directions on package and fill dishes. Let stand in a warm room until firm.

CORN RELISH SALAD

1 pkg. lemon-flavored gelatin 1 cup boiling water 3/4 cup cold water 2 tablespoons vinegar 1/2 cups corn cooked 1 green pepper, chopped 1/2 pimento, chopped 1 tablespoon onion, grated Dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Add cold water, vinegar and salt. Chill. When slightly thickened, fold in corn, pepper, pimento and onion. Turn into mold. Chill until firm. Unmold on crisp lettuce. Garnish with mayonnaise. Serves eight.

OATMEAL DROP CAKES

2-3 cups butter 1 cup sugar 2 eggs 1/2 cup milk 2 cups rolled oats 2 1/2 cups flour 1 teaspoon baking powder 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon 1 teaspoon nutmeg 1 cup chopped seeded raisins Cream butter, add sugar, eggs well beaten, milk and rolled oats. Mix and sift dry ingredients. Add flour mixture to first mixture, thoroughly mix. Drop by spoonfuls on a greased baking pan and bake in a rather hot oven. This makes 22 to 24 cookies.

TOMATOES STUFFED WITH VEAL

Wipe and remove the slices from stem end of six medium-size tomatoes. Take out seeds and pulp, sprinkle inside of tomatoes with salt. Cook two tablespoons butter with one-half tablespoon finely-chopped onion for five minutes. Add one-half cup chopped cold veal, one-half cup stale bread crumbs, tomato pulp, and salt and pepper to taste. Cook five minutes, then add one egg slightly beaten; cook one minute, and fill tomato with this mixture. Place in buttered pan, sprinkle with cracker crumbs and bake for twenty minutes in a hot oven.

COFFEE BEFORE BREAKFAST

The hostess who wishes to add a bit of hospitality to the entertainment of her holiday guests can do so by serving them coffee in their rooms before breakfast. It is something that is sure to please. The coffee should be made double strength and served in demi-tasse with or without sugar. Of course, it should be hot. For years it has been the custom in the South to send demi-tasse to the rooms of guests at the time they arise. They drink the strong, fragrant beverage and are ready for more at breakfast. Recently the pre-breakfast demi-tasse or "coffee cocktail" as it is sometimes called, has been adopted by a number of hotels and railroad dining cars.

GRAPEFRUIT AND FIG SALAD

2 large grapefruit 1 few preserved figs 1 lemon for dressing Peel fruit, remove membrane from each section, cut meat into pieces and arrange on crisp lettuce leaves with figs. Serve with dressings made of lemon or lime juice, a dash of paprika and a suggestion of powdered sugar. (One teaspoon to a half cup of dressing.)

HOLIDAY SPECIALS

(By Betty Barclay) HOLIDAY LUNCHEON DISH 1 box sardines 1 lemon 1 bunch radishes 1 Parsley or watercress Remove cover neatly and entirely from a box of sardines. Place on a platter, and surround with wreath of parsley or cress. Cut radishes in the shape of flowers, and arrange in the parsley. Cut lemons in halves, crosswise, and then cut in deep points. Arrange at ends and sides of platter, in the parsley. Serve very cold.

APRICOT WHIP DESSERT

1 package lemon junket 1 pint milk 1/4 cup stewed apricots 2 teaspoons sugar 2 egg whites Make junket according to directions on package. Beat the egg whites until stiff, add the apricots, which have been put through a sieve, and mix thoroughly. Fill on top of junket when ready to serve.
