ORDINANCE NO. 203 AN ORDINANCE CALLING FOR AN SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN CERTAIN TERRITORY TO BE KNOWN AS McDONALD TRACT DISTRICT ON THE 2ND DAY OF JUNE, 1930, AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID DISTRICT THE PROPOSITION OF ANNEXING SAID DISTRICT TO THE CITY OF TORRANCE.

The City Council of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows: Section 1. There was filed with the City Clerk of the City of Torrance at a meeting thereof held on the 23rd day of April, 1930, a petition signed by 40 persons, who were found by the City Clerk of the City of Torrance, by comparison of their signatures with the great register

curve to the northerly prolongation of the westerly line of Hawthorne Avenue as described in a deed to Los Angeles County recorded in Book 27, Page 128, on file in the office of the Surveyor of said County; thence southerly along said last mentioned northerly prolongation to the northerly boundary of the City of Torrance as same existed on January 23rd, 1930; thence easterly, northerly and easterly along said last mentioned northerly boundary to the point of beginning.

Section 3. Said City Council finds that said petition is in form required by that certain act of the Legislature of the State of California entitled "An act to provide for alteration of the boundaries of and for the annexation of territory to municipal corporations..."

Section 4. The ballots for said election shall carry the following question: "Shall McDonald Tract District be annexed to the City of Torrance?"

Section 5. An election is hereby called to be held on the 2nd day of June, 1930, in McDonald Tract District, which is more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the most northerly corner of the City of Torrance as the same existed on January 23rd, 1930, said northerly easterly corner being also a point in the westerly boundary of the City of Los Angeles as the same existed on January 23rd, 1930; thence northerly in a direct line along said last mentioned boundary through the northerly easterly corner of the easterly prolongation of the westerly line of Lot 1, Tract No. 6138 as shown on map recorded in Book 140, Page 5 of Maps, Records of Los Angeles County; thence westerly along said last mentioned easterly prolongation to the beginning of a curve concave to the northwest, tangent to said last mentioned easterly prolongation and having a radius of 30 feet, said curve being also the southeasterly boundary of said Lot 1; thence in a general northeasterly direction along said curve to the easterly corner of the northerly easterly corner of the said lot, tangent to said end of curve along the easterly line of said Lot 1 and the northerly prolongation thereof to the beginning of a curve concave to the southwest, tangent to said last mentioned northerly prolongation and having a radius of 30 feet, said last mentioned curve being also the northeasterly boundary of Lot 12, of aforesaid tract; thence in a general northerly direction along said last mentioned curve to the end of same; thence easterly, tangent to said last mentioned end of curve and along the easterly prolongation of the northerly line of said last mentioned Lot 12, to the southerly prolongation of the westerly line of Western Avenue as shown on Map No. C.S. 7995, Sheet No. 2 on file in the office of the Surveyor of said County; thence northerly along said last mentioned southerly prolongation and northerly, easterly and northerly along said last mentioned westerly line to the southerly line of Strawberry Street as shown on Map of McDonald Tract recorded in Book 15, Pages 21 and 22 of Miscellaneous Records of said County; thence westerly along the southerly line of said Strawberry Street to the southerly prolongation of the westerly line of Illinois Street as described in a deed to Los Angeles County recorded in Deed Book 34, Page 149, on file in the office of the Surveyor of said County; thence northerly along said last mentioned southerly prolongation and westerly line of said Illinois Street to the southerly line of Lot 64 of said McDonald Tract; thence easterly along the said southerly line to the southerly corner of said Lot 64; thence northerly along the easterly line of said last mentioned lot and the northerly prolongation thereof to the southeasterly line of Riverside-Redondo Boulevard as shown on Maps No. C.S. 78734 on file in the office of the Surveyor of said County; thence southerly along said last mentioned southeasterly line and its prolongation to the northerly corner of Tract No. 8966 as shown on map recorded in Book 135, Pages 22 and 23 of Maps, Records of said County; said northeasterly corner being a point in the easterly line of Roslin Street as shown on said last mentioned map; thence southerly along the easterly line of said Roslin Street to a line which is parallel with and distant 20 feet southerly, measured at right angles from the southerly prolongation of the aforesaid southeasterly line of Riverside-Redondo Boulevard; thence southerly along said parallel line to the westerly line of Ashley Street as shown on said last mentioned map; thence northerly along said last mentioned westerly line to the southerly line of Riverside-Redondo Boulevard as shown on said last mentioned map; thence southerly along said last mentioned southeasterly line and following the same in all its various courses to the easterly boundary of the City of Redondo Beach as the same existed on January 23rd, 1930; thence southerly along said last mentioned easterly boundary to the southeasterly corner thereof; thence in a direct line to the northeasterly corner of Block A, Belvidere, as shown on map recorded in Book 19, Page 26 of Maps, Records of said County; said last mentioned northeasterly corner being also a point in the westerly line of Hawthorne Avenue, as shown on said last mentioned map; thence southerly along said last mentioned westerly line to the beginning of a curve concave to the northwest as described in the deed to Los Angeles County in Deed Book 31, Page 68, on file in the office of the Surveyor of said County; thence southerly, along said last mentioned

Section 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper of general circulation printed and published within the City of Torrance, and thereupon this ordinance shall be in full force and effect.

Protest Bill at Restaurant Fight Follows

Lloyd Kerns and C. A. Jay, both of Long Beach, entered Jones Chicken Inn at Walleria Sunday evening and ordered food.

Whereas, by a Deed of Trust executed by Mayne Lowe, alias known as Mayne E. Lowe, and Bob Lowe, her husband, dated August 12, 1925, in Book 5387, Page 125, of Official Records in the office of the Recorder of Los Angeles County, California, said Trustee did grant the property therein and hereinafter described to Marine Trust and Savings Bank of Long Beach, a corporation, as Trustee, with power of sale, to secure, among other things, the payment of certain promissory note, in favor of the Long Beach Building and Loan Association, a California corporation, and other sums of money advanced and interest thereon; and

WHEREAS, Bank of Italy National Trust and Savings Association, a banking association, has by operation of law succeeded to all of the rights, powers and duties of said Trust and Savings Bank, a corporation; and

WHEREAS, said Deed of Trust provides that should breach or default be made in payment of any indebtedness and/or in performance of any obligation, covenant, promise or agreement therein mentioned, then the owner and holder of said note may declare all sums secured thereby, immediately due, and may require the Trustee to sell the property thereby granted; and
