## State Crops Are Reported In Fine

SACRAMENTO, (UP)—Californa's climate lived up to its repu-ation again during the past month,

same crops were ruined by drought. The California Cooperative Crop Reporting Service has compiled its summer reaume of the field crop situation and round the state in a most advantageous position.

Of the 15 major neid crops in the state, only three indicate a decrease in production for the year. They are cotton, potatoes, and "tame hay", exclusive of alfolfa and grain hay.
