## New Chevrolet To Be Revealed Next Saturday

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Nov. 13.—Definite assurances that Chevrolet will introduce a new car for 1981 on Saturday was revealed here today during the staging by Chevrolet factory officials of the first of fifty dealer meetings to be held in the next five weeks throughout the country. Included in a carload of equipment brought in for the meeting was a new car substantially bigger than the current model, and extensively changed in appearance.

Although the meeting was closed to the public, it was learned that H. J. Klingler, vice president and general sales manager of the Chevrolet Motor company, who attended the meeting here, told the 500 dealers and associated bankers in attendance at the city auditorium that the car would be publicly announced the coming Saturday, and that, despite its increased size and improved appearance, it would be priced considerably below current levels.

"Big Car" Appearance  
Dramatic incidents attended the presentation of the car. It was trucked under the canvas from the freight shed to the stage of the auditorium, where it was boxed in by velvet drops and under a flood of spotlights, disclosed to the audience. A burst of applause greeted the unveiling of the car, and when the announcement of new lower prices was made, a wild cheering dealer group interrupted proceedings for several minutes.

"The car is no longer than the present Chevrolet, and changes and refinements are so extensive that it has a decided "big car" appearance, one dealer reported. If the sentiment among the dealers here is any criterion, the new car ought to prove the most successful product in the history of the company.

In Torrance Soon  
Jack Hanson of the Torrance Motor company, stated that he would have the new models in Torrance within a few days, probably as early as Saturday this week.

## Here's Your New Car!



LONDON, Eng.—A revolutionary new automobile shaped like an airship and capable of greater speed as a sedan seating seven than as a stripped chassis, was recently demonstrated in London by its inventor, Sir Dennis Burney, designer and builder of the giant English airship R-100. In appearance the "Burney streamline," as the new car is called, suggests the airship with low front, sloping windshield, crescent curved top and long, tapering end, extending far beyond the rear wheels. Another innovation is the engine at the rear, which eliminates noise, heat and fumes while driving. Sir Dennis asserts that if the car could reach 180 miles an hour it would actually rise in the air owing to its streamlining. It is a straight eight, of twenty-two horsepower and is capable of 90 miles an hour. Smooth riding is assured by having each wheel independently sprung.
