Two Ads Exploiting "New City of Torrance" Bob Deisinger Has Copy of 1913 L. A. Tribune With

A bitter fight was going on in Los Angeles in 1923, according to Deisinger's Tribune, over a proposed amendment to install the waste system of government.

The 17-year-old newspaper, brown-yellow in color, reveals that attention was being given to the public eye, as a "human fly" was slightly injured when a rocket, in which he was to fly 3,000 feet in the air.
