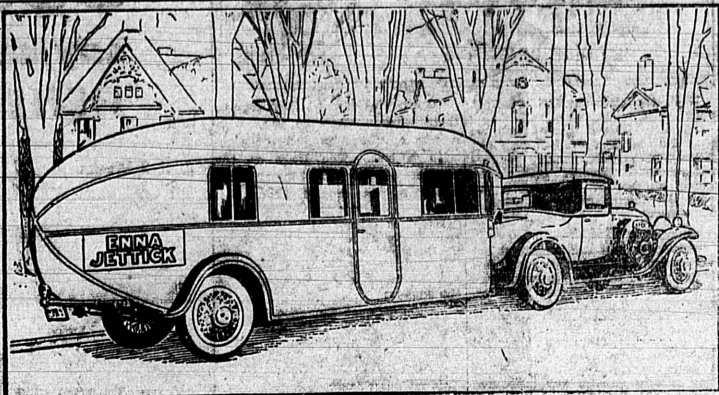

The Enna Jettick Aerocar, pictured above, will visit Torrance Thursday, December 18, according to Sam Levy, local dealer for the popular Enna Jettick footwear for women. It is one of a fleet of cars now touring the United States and is capable of taking the road at automobile speed and bringing the salesman to the door of the local dealer in a luxuriously equipped sample room.

Sam Johnson, custodian from the Enna Jettick factory, will be in charge of the display here next week, Sam Levy reports. The Aerocar was built by Glenn Curless, and its lines are those of an airplane body. Attached by an ingenious bird's beak coupling to a coupe which furnishes the motive power, the Aerocar is mounted to ride with the utmost smoothness. Modernistic wicker and plush furniture, a radio, a telephone, barometer and ship's clock make up its furnishings. At the rear is a room for carrying the shoe samples from which Levy will make his spring and summer selections. The Aerocar weighs only 1200 pounds.

(Continued from Page 1-A) the suit through the Superior Court. Pending the filing of the suit in the Appellate Court, attorneys for the water company are reported to have agreed to withhold the filing of injunction proceedings in the Superior Court.

Propose Sale to City

Meanwhile, representatives of Eastern land interests who own holdings in the parent organization of which the local water company is a unit, are reported to be working independently of the water company attorneys and directly with city officials and private citizens in an effort to effect a sale of the present water system to the city.

Secret Parleys Held

Several conferences have been held between these bond house representatives and a group of citizens in Torrance, but the meetings have been cloaked in deep secrecy. All representatives of the press have not been invited or permitted to attend. At the last conference, held Monday evening, Mayor Dennis and City Engineer Frank Leonard were invited for the first time.

While no report of the secret conferences was given, it is understood that the price asked by the bond house representatives for the present system is greatly in excess of the value placed upon the usable portion of the present system by City Engineer Frank Leonard. It is expected that Mayor Dennis will submit a report of the secret conferences to the City Council on Tuesday evening.

KOREAN POPULATION UP

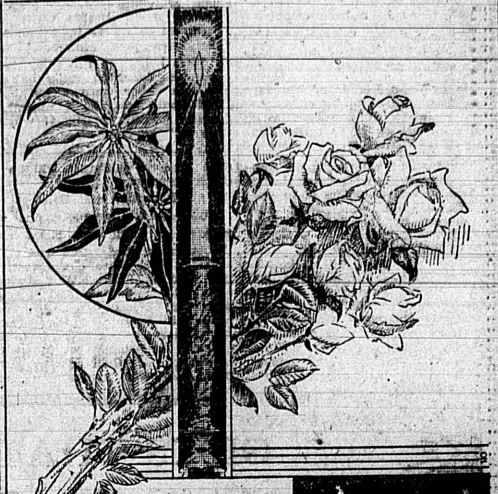
