Urge Vaccination Of All Children

Vaccinate your children against smallpox before they are a year old. That's the advice to California parents from the United States public health service. If vaccinated before a year old, the children are rendered immune virtually from the start. On entering school, they should again be vaccinated. Here's why:
1.—Vaccination doesn't always protect for life.
2.—It requires reinforcement of the immunity in many individuals to make sure of protection against heavy exposures to smallpox. Fortunately, it is pointed out, if the child is already immune, the new vaccination will not "take." Instead, there will be merely a little red spot that appears for only about a day. This is known as the "immune reaction."
