Home Nursing Hints

Flaxseed poultices and Turpentine stipes. A poultice is the application of moist heat in the form of a soft paste which retains its heat for a varying length of time, according to the ingredient used. Flaxseed is the most commonly used for poulticing as it has many virtues. It holds the heat for a greater length of time, and due to its oily substance is very soothing to the skin, is very light in weight and can be used on a very tender area without causing much pressure.

The temperature of the poultice should be as hot as the patient can stand, and is tested on the back of the hand. Procedure in making up a flaxseed poultice is the same as that of a mustard plaster. Flaxseed may be purchased from drug stores in quantities desired and is added to a pint of boiling water. Allow the water to come to a boil and while boiling add the flaxseed, stirring constantly with a spoon.

When the mixture will drop clean from the spoon, it is of the right consistency. It must then be heated to introduce air into it, making it as light as possible. This must all be done, very fast to prevent much cooling. Then place on muslin and envelope in the same way you would a mustard plaster, turning in all the corners to prevent any material from coozing out. Allow the poultice to remain on as long as
