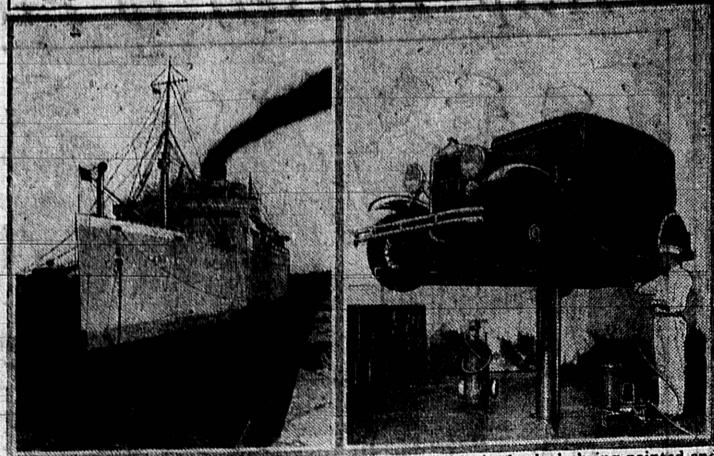
Hatchery Tries For National Honors

Hill Stresses Importance of Re-Appportionment Program

Ben A. Hill of San Pedro, assemblyman for the 72nd District of the Assembly, has been appointed on the following committees: commerce and navigation; chairman; banking, fish and game; re-apportionment; judiciary; agriculture; building and loan associations; county government; irrigation; revenue and taxation.

These are 10 of the most important committees in the Legislature. The re-apportionment committee has a majority consisting of Southern California members.

In commenting, Hill has stated that: "This Southern California majority on the committee will insure a re-apportionment bill to be reported on the floor of the Assembly which will give all of Southern California a fair representation in Washington, D. C., consisting of six additional Congressmen from Los Angeles (one to be from the San Pedro Harbor District) and of Assembly representation in Sacramento, consisting of at least seven and probably eight additional Assemblymen from Los Angeles County, in accordance with the 1930 Federal census, is not interested in the personal ambitions of some of the members of the Legislature, whether they are from Southern California, or from Northern California, and I will continue to vote for, and work for those things and those principles which are for the best interests of the people whom I represent, and not for those things which are designed to satisfy the political ambitions of some individual member."

Yesteryears' Newspapers

R. C. McMullen, Local Butcher, Has Old Copy of New York Herald of 1863

(Editor's Note: Have you a copy of an old newspaper? If you have, The Herald would like to see it and pass on its interesting features to our readers. All old papers will be returned to the owners intact within a week after they are received.)

Yellowed, stained and ragged, the New York Herald, dated Sunday, February 15, 1863, presents our subject this week. It is the property of R. C. McMullen, who is a butcher at the Piggly Wiggly store here. He obtained it back in Franklin, Pa., in 1890, when he was working in a news store. The Herald of 67 years ago was among a pile of old papers which McMullen went through and he prevailed upon his employer to let him have it for a souvenir.

In the center of the front page is a wood-cut map depicting "Scene of the Naval Conflict of Charleston—Position of the Contending Vessels." News from New Orleans, brought by the United States steam transport Empire City to New York, and of Jamaica, which tells of the arrival of the Confederate steamer-of-war Alabama at Port Royal, occupy most of the front page.

In 1863, the Herald was edited by the famous journalist, James Gordon Bennett.

Another thing that we notice about the paper—and it has eight pages—is the total absence of any humorous columns, quips or jokes. It is devoid of that variety which is probably being used too much by the metropolitan dailies of today. The 67-year-old paper also lacks anything of special interest to women—being no fashion notes, patterns or "household hints."

Perhaps the most interesting feature about McMullen's old newspaper is the fact that it is printed from very small type—considerably smaller than the type used to print this series. AND it was all set by hand! One marvels at the eyesight of those type-setters, who worked under gas light setting "stick" or "stick" (as the implement to hold the type in the hand is known) of straight news matter.
