ORDINANCE NO. 216
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE PROHIBITING THE POSSESSION BY CERTAIN MINORS OF FIREARMS, AIRGUNS, AND EXPLOSIVES.

The City Council of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows:

Section 1
It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 18 years to have in his possession, or custody or control any gun, revolver, pistol, spring or air gun, or firearm of any description, or any cartridge, shell or other device containing any explosive, or any gun, pistol, or other device connected with any gun, revolver, pistol, or firearm of any description, or any ammunition of any explosive.

Section 2
Any person guilty of a violation of this Ordinance shall be punished by fine of not to exceed \$100.00 or by imprisonment in the Torrance City Jail for not to exceed 30 days; or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3
The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper, printed and published in the City of Torrance, and thereupon and thereafter the same shall be in full force.

Frost Guilty Of Attacking Sons

Committed to Hospital Pending Sentence

Edward C. Frost, chief petty officer with nearly 19 years service in the Navy, was convicted in the Long Beach Superior Court yesterday of three counts of assault with intent to do great bodily harm to his three young sons. The court held that Frost was guilty of assault to Jackie, 10; Fred, seven, and Torrance, six, in a field near the Torrance home of their grandmother last November.

The officer was ordered committed to the general hospital for observation and test of his blood condition pending sentence. He was acquitted of the charges of intent to commit murder of his sons on the grounds that the state had failed to prove intent.
