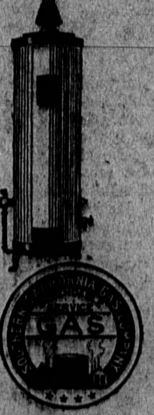

### Long Distance Cable Under Construction

Twenty-one miles of underground long distance cable is now being placed between Los Angeles and Long Beach to provide additional facilities for the Los Angeles Harbor area. Approximately \$35,000 will be expended for the project, work on which will be finished by the Southern California Telephone Company during the late spring. The cable will connect with the new \$2,000,000 long distance office at Los Angeles.

### Stopover Privilege Benefits Travelers

If you're riding on a one-way ticket via Southern Pacific now, and you take a notion to stop over at any place en route, don't hesitate a moment. Just break your journey when and where you please for it will be all right with the railroad company under the new stopover rules, according to an announcement received here this week.

There is only one provision—the traveler must reach his destination within 30 days, unless time-out is taken at regular 10-day stopover points, in which case an extension of 10 days may be obtained, it was stated. Formerly, it was pointed out, railroad practice required passengers with one-way tickets to make continuous trips, excepting 10-day stops at certain points. It was also required under previous regulations that tickets be deposited with company agents at stop-over cities. But these conditions are removed by the new stopover rules.
