**S. PLANT  
GETS LARGE  
STEEL JOBS**

**Irving Company Given  
Capacity Business For  
Five Weeks**

In the first consignments of the International-Stagey Derwent Equipment plant today, shipping was reported ready for more than a month's capacity at the Carson street manufacturing concern. Nearly 400 tons of steel will be fabricated at the I-S. plant into two suspension bridges to be constructed at the Colorado River near Lee City and Hoover Dam. Second order, for two courses of steel transmission poles, received by the company this week, it was learned by the Herald. This will be shipped to the Sierra Power Company Riverside. All steel for this plant here, it was reported, capacity production at the International-Stagey plant will be in for about five or six weeks use the Six Companies' bridge order must be delivered in weeks. The bulk of the steel for the plant will come from local Columbia Steel plant, the remainder being ordered to the I-S. plant from Columbia Steel's Los Angeles house and Pittsburg plant. Reports received here week by the International-Stagey branch told of the purchase of all the stock of the Stagey Manufacturing Company of Cincinnati by the recently organized Corporation. The purchase of the Stagey Manufacturing ended controversy which had been going on for many years and closed matter satisfactorily to both sides, it was reported. The concern was one of the oldest and best firms in the country, designer of the design and fabricator of casholers and other high pressure tankage.

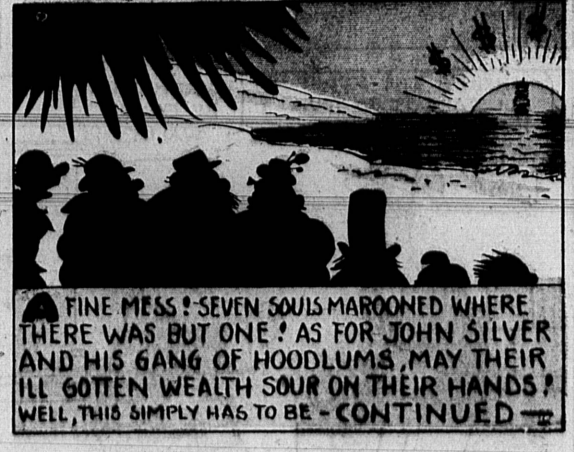
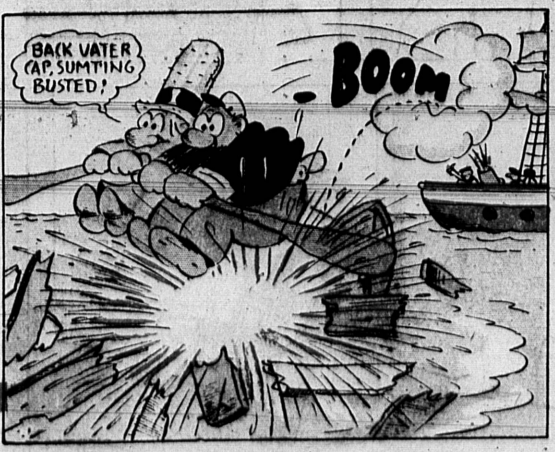
