Change Street's Name

Clerk Bartlett read a communication from the Pacific Electric Railway Company dated October 15, 1931, acknowledging resolution of the City Council of the proposed change of the name of the street from California to the name of Redondo Boulevard, stating that approval of the Board of Directors of the Railway Company would be necessary before the matter could be finally closed.

Wants Park Maintenance

Mr. E. W. Markow of Hollywood Park discussed the question of the City furnishing certain services to the Clifford F. Bell, Inc., particularly in reference to tree planting and police protection. No specific requests were made. The matter was referred to Councilman Bell for investigation.

Prairie Avenue Report

City Attorney Findley reported the brief on the Water Suit de-murrer has been filed and that the Judge would undoubtedly render a judgment in favor of the City. City Attorney Findley also reported that extension of time had been granted the General Petroleum Corporation on the Prairie Avenue proceedings.

ORDINANCE NO. 227

A petition was presented from the Chamber of Commerce of Waltheria requesting the Council to lend whatever assistance possible in abating the dust condition due to the operation of the Decalite Company located in that community. The petition was signed by 111 people.

Right-of-Way Cleaned Up

A communication was read from the Santa Fe Railway Company, dated October 15, 1931, stating that the cleaning up of their right-of-way between Carson and Sierra streets, as requested, had been completed.

Quarrel Leads to Gun Play, Arrest

LOMITA.—As a result of a quarrel Saturday night on Redondo boulevard, Lloyd Quigley of San Pedro was brought into Judge Debnly's court Monday morning charged with threatening J. B. Taylor with a deadly weapon. Taylor, who was present to have been drinking, knocked Quigley down. Quigley drew a Smith-Wesson 38 and fired a shot, which went wild. It was asserted Quigley was fined \$25 or 100 days with sentence suspended for two years.
