Including \$60,02,100 in certificates of deposit, \$10,112,317,73 in active deposits and \$40,888,978.66 in exchange and some additional cash, the state treasurer today accounted for \$81,216,555.25 as compared with \$70,124,052,12 at this time in 1930. The sum will be depleted by \$11,000,000 or more dollars a month hence when school fund apportionments have been paid, Director of Finance R. A. Vandegriff announced. Cash in the state coffers represents about \$16 for each individual in the state.
