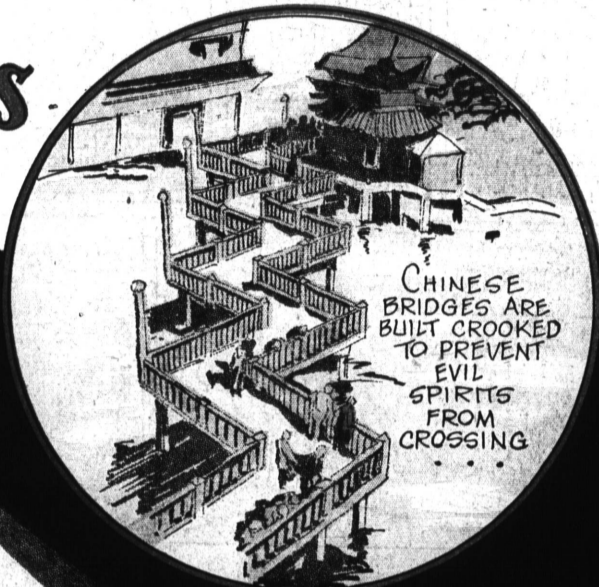

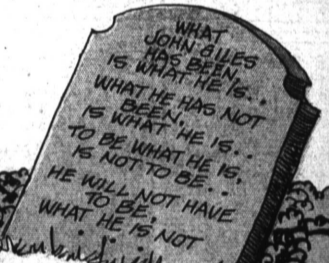

THIS 25-FOOT SPRUCE IS GROWING OUT OF AN OLD PINE STUMP near Antigo, Wis.

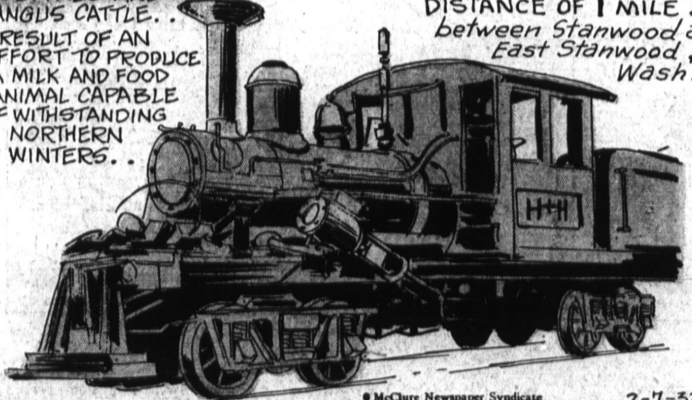
