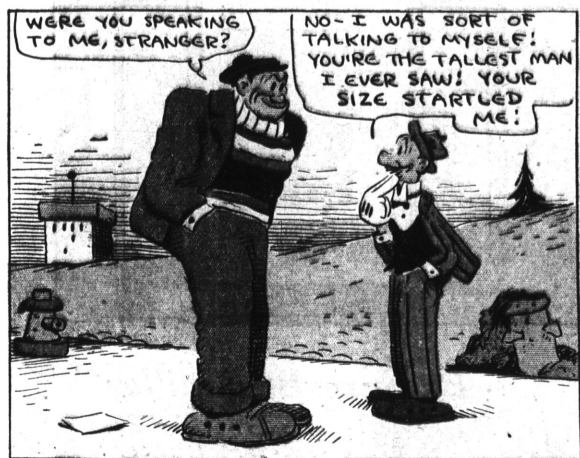

Mass Meeting at High School Auditorium Set For Next Week

Hundreds of residents of the two towns, Keystone and Harbor, have signified their willingness to take part in the movement to obtain a 30 per cent reduction in taxes and place a limit on the amount of tax levy, according to Beverly B. Smith, who is in charge of the work here, Mr. Smith with N. H. Cline, Mrs. Thomas R. Willis, Judge S. D. Peterson and others of Lomita, have been circulating petitions, and in many ways arousing the interest of the communities to a realization of the importance of the opportunity to protect their interests. The movement, which originated with John T. Gaffney of Pedro several weeks ago, has led to a number of communications in Southern California and was promise of becoming a powerful lever in obtaining tax reforms.
