Third Group of Mexicans Repatriated

Families Aided by County Welfare Department Will Be Sent Home

LOS ANGELES.— (C.N.S.) — Indigent Mexicans and their families living in agricultural areas of Los Angeles county to the number of about 1200 will be repatriated to Mexico under action of the board of supervisors in appropriating \$12,000 additional for this work. This group, the third in recent months, will be returned in March.

The appropriation, the third one for this purpose, was made upon recommendation of W. A. Harriman, county superintendent of charities, who stated that these indigents cost the welfare department almost as much a month to maintain here as the expense incident to returning them to Mexico. Supérvisor Frank L. Shaw, head of the supervisorial committee on charities, stated four trains would be used to take the new group back to Mexico, where they will be accepted at the border by the Mexican government and distributed to their former homes in the neighboring republic.

Two of the trainloads will be taken to El Paso for distribution by the Mexican government from Juarez, across the Mexican border there, and the other two trains will transport the indigents to Nogales, for distribution by Mexican authorities from that point.
