



SACRAMENTO, Calif.—(U.P.)—As another presidential primary passes into history, political interest in California shifts to the state primary August 30. At this election a corking good fight is in prospect for the Republican nomination for United States senator.

Southern California has contributed four of the five challengers for the senatorial toga now worn by Senator Samuel M. Shortridge. These include Congressmen Phil D. Swing and Joe Crail, Leo V. Youngworth and the Rev. Robert P. Shuler. In Northern California State Senator Taliant Tubbs is conducting a campaign on a platform for nodification of the Volstead act.

Remembering the governor's fixed policy that every visiting governor must be welcomed by a salute of 17 guhs, observers are predicting that the cannon in Sacramento will be busy for some time after the state executives arrive.

Merriam didn't stir up much fuss while he served as "acting governor" during Rolph's absence . . In fact, he spent most of his time at the state capitol in his own offices.
