Bell Will Open School and Camp at Laguna Beach Home

Because of the fact that the Los Angeles city schools are to have no summer session this year, William M. Bell, Jr., principal of the elementary school here is announcing a combination recreation camp and school to be conducted under the direct supervision of his wife and himself. The camp will be located at the Bell's Laguna Beach home which is ideally situated conveniently near the ocean and at the base of the coastal hills in the Arch Beach section. The house is a large, rambling home with ample space for dormitories and living quarters. It was one of the first residences built in this section of Laguna.

Daily hikes and swims will be prominent features of the camp. Points of historical interest in Orange and San Diego counties will be visited by automobile. A library to furnish supervised reading will be provided. Academic instruction to correct deficiencies or make rapid progress in school work will be offered, but will be optional. Dancing instruction will be available for those interested, this work to be under the supervision of Miss Virginia Bell, a dancer of considerable experience. Miss Bell is the possessor of several gold medals won in recent years by her solo dancing.

Mrs. Bell will give individual assistance in the fundamental subjects of the curriculum. She has had special preparation and experience for this work through seven years as head of the pioneer private school in San Pedro. Recently she has been studying at the University of California at Los Angeles, and she also taught at the summer sessions at Torrance elementary school during several years. Many of Mrs. Bell's former pupils are now continuing their education in the most select private schools in the Southland.

Mr. Bell will have general supervision of the camp and especially the recreational features. His 15 years of experience as a principal in the city schools have been supplemented by work as city playground director and worker with boys under the division of attendance in the public schools.

In discussing his plans yesterday, Mr. Bell stressed the fact that the camp will have all the features of a home and the organization will be that of a family. "We hope to take these youngsters in as our own for the period of their stay," he said, "assign each one some specific share in the routine of the camp, and do all in our power to make his stay a happy one. Boys and girls of elementary and junior high school age will be accepted."
