

Three hours after the U. S. Marines at New York, Boston, Norfolk and other east coast naval stations have raised the flag, the Marines at posts along the Pacific seaboard present arms to the colors as they are hauled smartly to the top of the flagstaff—the time interval varying only when daylight saving is in vogue.

About two and a half hours later the ceremony is repeated in the Hawaiian islands. More than five hours have rolled around before the flag is raised by the soldiers of the sea in the far-off Philippines, and at virtually the same hour in Shanghal, China, the Marines of the Fourth Regiment hoist the flag above their regimental headquarters.
