With the August primaries over, nomination papers for independent candidates were being circulated today, according to W. M. Kerr, registrain of voters. These may be filed any time between September 9 and 29.

Canvass of the bellots cast at last Tuesday's election is now ungder way in the hall of records. This must be completed by September 15, and probably will be completed several days prior, as party conventions must be held September 13, and those elected must be known by that time so that a chairman may be elected and committees chosen.

Wednesday, September 14, is the last day for candidates to file a sintement of their receipts and expenditures. State convention of the political parties must be held in Sacramento on September 15, and the state central committee is convene at Sacramento on September 24.

Regarding independent nominations, Registrar Kerr points out that a candidate for any public office, including presidential electors either as individuals or by groups, for which no aconpartisan candidate has been nominated at any primary election, may be nominated subsequent to said primary by circulation of a nominating petition and obtaining signatures of at least 5 per cent of the entire vote cast at the last preceding general election.
