SACRAMENTO.—(U.P.) — A salary cut is still in prospect for members of the California state legislature.

A bill now being proposed for the 1933 session which convenes next January would reduce the legislators pay from the \$2,000, they now receive every two years, to \$1,000 it was in 1924 before the people granted the boost in pay.

The matter of a salary cut was rist suggested following a letter by Rolland A. Vandegrift, directog of the state department of finance, to Assemblyman Robert L. Patterson of Tatt, administrative flood

leader.

Vandegrift didn't minee words.

"The legislature should clean its,
own house and eliminate all extravagance and unnecessary expenses," he said, bluntly.

Legislative costs, Vandegrift
pointed out, have more than
'oubled in the last 10 years—from
\$416,728 in 1920-22 to \$868,992 in
1930-31.

in Pennsylvania and \$30 in New York.

New York pays its legislators a flat salary of \$2,500 a year; Illinois, \$3,500 for 2 years; Massachusetts, \$1,500 a year; Pennsylvania, \$3,000 for 2 years; California and Wisconsin, \$2,400 for 2 years, and Ohio, \$2,000 for 2 years, California pays of the same as California paid in 1924.

All other states pay their law-makers a "per diem" for the time they are actually in session, ranging from \$3 in Oregon, Michigan and Kanisas, to \$15 in Arizona. The average is \$5, paid by Idaho, Maryland, Missouri, New Jersey, North Dakota, South Dakota and Washington.
