# Mysteries of Science to Be Lecture Topic

Irwin Moon Bringing Much Interesting Equipment to South Lomita Church

On Thursday and Friday evening next week, Irwin Moon will deliver two remarkable lectures at South Lomita church. On October 20th his subject will be, "The Telescope, the Microscope and the Bible," This lecture is illustrated with about 100 sildes including some of the latest photos taken with the 100-linh (clescope, and a series of photo-micrographs photographed through a compound microscope. He will also bring with him the microscopes, a telescope and some radium in which the flash of the explosion of atoms may be seen.

The following evening Mr. Moon

The following evening Mr. Moon will speak on "Christ, the Light of the World." At that time he will bring the micro-projector for the polarization of light and project microscopic objects on the screen magnified more than 109,000 times in projection. He will also have with him a 2,000 voit transformer with which he will produce Ultraviolet light for the florescent minerals.

Mr. Moon has been in demand for these lectures at various schools. He has showed the slides in Pasadena College and to students of the junior college at Long Beach, as well as in a number of Imperial Valley high schools. He has been invited by the science department of Lincoln high school of Los Angeles to speak and demonstrate with this fascinating material.
