Contracts Are Let For Materials In Aqueduct Project

Metropolitan water district officials were assured today of funds with which to continue work on the Colorado river aqueduct project, following a Reconstruction Finance Corporation bid yesterday on a \$4,832,000 block of aqueduct bonds. The R. F. C. bid is in accordance with an agreement between the Corporation and the Metropolitan Water District under which the federal organization pledged itself to bid on and purchase aqueduct bonds up to \$40,000,000. A \$2,016,000 block has already been purchased by the corporation.

Action on the bid was deferred by directors of the district until the board meeting held on Wednesday, February 1.

At the same time the district board awarded three contracts for materials to be used in conscious with preliminary aqueduct construction. One was a \$31,592 with the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Company for insulators; another with the Graybar Electric Company for significant with the Graybar Electric Company for \$3,213 worth of insulator pins; and the third with the Richfield Oil Company for 900,000 gallons of road oil costing \$11,727.

The electrical equipment is to be used in the ersection of a power transmission line along the aqueduct route between Cabazon and Hayfield. The oil will be utilized in the surfacing of roads along the Coachella division unit of the big water carrier.

Arizona Desert Was Once Fertile

PHOENIX, Ariz.—Excavations of the municipally owned ruins of Pueblo Grande, the largest orehistoric structure in the Salt River valley, reveal facts that show the present irrigation and farming culture of this region is but a repetition of what took place in the prehistoric days of a chousand or more years ago.

Archaeology shows, that the ashes upon which the present city of Phoenix and its thousands of acres of adjacent farm lands has arisen represent the remains of several large communities whose concerted efforts wrested from a barren desert a vertrable garden spot, irrigated and farmed on a scale comparable to that of present times.

With their stone age tools the anclents constructed a network of large canals, approximately 425 miles of which recently have been mapped by the aid of serial photography and many sections of which are still visible and comparable in size to the modern canals.
