Corporations Pay State Tax

Many citizens do not know who pays the state tax and will benefit most by the proposed amendment. In the state of California, according to the constitution, all taxes paid into the state treasury come from a tax upon certain corporations, largely the following: Steam railroads, electric railways, sas and electric companies, telephone and telegraph companies, incomes of certain insurance companies and banks.

The balance of school money in cointy and city comes from direct taxes upon common property and personal property. No person who pays his tax bill to the county treasurer pays any money directly to the state of California. It is pointed out that if a reduction is made in the state money, this belps the corporations that pay state taxes but is not necessarily a help to those who pay local taxes.
