Giving new impetus to Colorado river aqueduct construction, the contract for the building of the 13-mile San Jacinto tunnel was executed Friday by General Manager and Chief Engineer F. E. Weymouth of the Metropolitan Water District and Emil Henoch of the construction firm of Wengel and Henoch.

Exeguition of the \$7.339,100 contract brought to a close four months of negotiations. The ducument was signed by General Manager Weymouth for the Metropolitan water district and by Emil Henoch for the Milwaukee firm.

First construction, it was indicated, will consist of road building and the erection of camps. It is estimated that from 600 to 700 men will be employed on this tunnel section of the aqueduct throughout a six-year construction period.
