The passage of this ordinance would be a disadvantage to many residents of Lomita, who have been able to secure some employment in the beach city. Those who are opposing its passage point out that many Long Beach residents are employed as longshoremen at the docks in Wilmington and San Pedro, and that the restrictions as to outside labor being employed in Long Beach would be discriminatory, undesirable, and subversive of constitutional rights.
