Library District In Palos Verdes Must Raise \$7125

The Palos Verdes Library district will be asked to raise \$7125 to cover the 1933-34 budget of the Palos Verdes public library, according to a formal statement filed with the board of supervisors this week.

It will be the duty of the supervisors to fix a tax rate which will produce the necessary revenue from the district, just as the supervisors have been required by law to levy a tax for the various school districts, to meet the budget agreed upon by the boards of trustees. However, the general county-wide school tax, which last year jumped to 45 cents, has been wiped out by passage of the Riley Stewart bill last June 27. Special rates for the flood control district, the road districts and other districts will be fixed shortly by the supervisors.

The \$7125 for the Palos Verdes library is divided as follows: \$3000 for service, and \$4125 for additional books, supplies, furniture, equipment and landscaping.
