"KING KONG," COLOSSAL FILM, COMING TO LOMITA



There is something new under the sun-arcs, and Merian C. Cooper and Ernest B. Schoedsack, with their production of "King Kong," have done it!

The producers of "Grass" and "Chang" have soared grandly into the realms of imagination for the super-fantasy, "King Kong," the RKO Radio picture featuring Fay Wray, Robert Armstrong and Bruce Cabot, coming to the Lomita Theatre, Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, September 3, 4 and 5.

With the late Edgar Wallace, Cooper conceived the extravagantly fantastic idea of bringing the prehistoric age into juxtaposition with the modern age.
