

I have heard radio speakers tell of salts which when placed in the bath are quaranteed by the promoters to reduce anyone quickly and without recourse to diet or exercise. Others declare all overweight due to glandular disturbances, for which their tablets are said to be corrective.

#### **Public Drinking Places Barred Under California Initiative Act**

SACRAMENTO.—Seeking to protect prospective liquor dealers from heavy financial losses, due to misunderstanding of the state's new regulatory liquor act, the state board of equalization, which is charged with the responsibility of liquor regulation, today issued act adopted by the people last Notation with the lawn and corporations are preparing to build and equip saloons and other public drinking places, apparently under the misconception that such places will be legalized with repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment.
