Court to Fix Settlement In Boulevard Case

Suit Filed Soon In Condemnation Suit Over Lomita Street

Employment of George N. Seymour as an expert witness for the county in condemnation proceedings for the acquisition of property needed for the widening of Lomita boulevard was authorized this week by the board of supervisors, at the request of the county counsel's office.

Seymour was suggested because of his familiarity with property values in the district, and because of his qualifications as a building engineer and an architect, according to Harold W. Kennedy, deputy county counsel who is preparing the condemnation proceedings on behalf of the county. Seymour will be paid \$25 a day for not to exceed three days.

Property to be condemned is owned by Walter Goslin, Charlotte R. Smith and Charles M. Smith. Settlement out of court is out of the question, it was indicated, and the court will have to fix the amount of the awards. The condemnation suit is expected to be filed shortly.

A delegation composed of Mayor Conner, City Engineer Leonard, Charles M. Smith, and a representative of the Doherty-Stone Drill Company called on Supervisor Quinn last week and were informed by Quinn that the county is ready to proceed with the improvement as soon as legal matters are settled.
