

Tax Collections On a Par With Takings Last Year

Collection of 1933-34 second installment taxes today were on their way to the \$50,000,000 mark, with the passing of the \$50,000,000 mark last Friday, according to W. O. Welch, county tax collector.

Each day's total is increasing, according to Welch, and last Friday's collections exceeded three-quarters of a million dollars. Friday's payments of \$791,170 brought the year's total to \$71,139,022, or 67.75 per cent of the \$87,000,000 to be collected.

Collections are close behind those for the corresponding day of last year, Welch's books revealed. One year ago to the day the percentage collected stood at 58.84.

Low Fares Continue to Next September

Announcement that the western railroads had extended until September 30 the present low experimental passenger fares, including elimination of the Pullman surcharge, was received here today by Lawson Overman, District Agent of the Southern Pacific.

It was pointed out that travel by train has been increasing steadily since adoption of the low fares last December and that continued increase in patronage will be the factor in determining permanent adoption of the low fare schedules.

4 Keys Unlock 13,000 Locks At General Hospital

One of the marvels of Inner Workings of Mammoth County Building

Although the county's new \$13,000,000 general hospital has 13,000 locks, four great-grand-daddy keys will unlock them all.

This is but one of the marvels of the inner workings of the largest single-unit hospital building in the world which opened its doors to the public for a formal inspection on Sunday, April 15.

The master-key system is one of the most elaborate ever built and was constructed especially for this hospital by the Yale Company. The system consists of 263 master keys, controlled by 19 grandmasters, which are in turn controlled by the four great-grand-master keys. A 325-page index has been published by the lock company to keep track of all these locks and keys and this book is being studied in the engineering colleges of Southern California by the students in architecture and mechanics.

The kitchen of the hospital, which is the largest institutional kitchen in the world, would delight the eye of the most scrupulous housewife. The rooms are white tile or concrete and officials of the hospital declare that "our housekeeper could serve lunch in any one of them to her bridge club without offense." Over 10,000 meals are prepared in it every day.

Another of the wonders of the immense unit is the special plaster which has been used in making the walls of the operating rooms and many of the other rooms. It is claimed to greatly improve the acoustics of the rooms where it is applied.

A tunnel, connecting the new hospital with the old is equipped with two bicycles and several pairs of roller skates. These vehicles speed up the messenger boys when they pass from one building to the other.
