**Greyhound Race Background In Robinson Film**

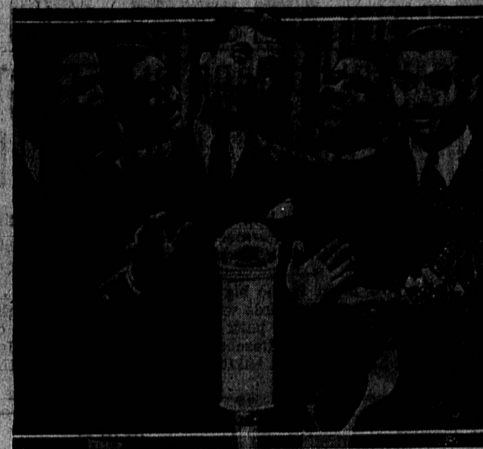

Blind College Has Track Team  
WATERTOWN, Mass. (U.P.)—Matthew DeMartino, track coach at Perkins Institution for the Blind, has devised a system by which the blind boys can run dashes, high jump and throw the shotput. De Martino, who has normal sight, explained that in the dashes a wire is strung along the track with a ring fastened around the wire and a rope tied to the ring. The boys hold the rope and the ring slides along. To warn the athletes of the finish line, a tape is bound around the wire and some rope ends dangle down. The shotput and high jump were the hardest events to master. Lack of vision was the cause of the difficulty because it hampers the form.
