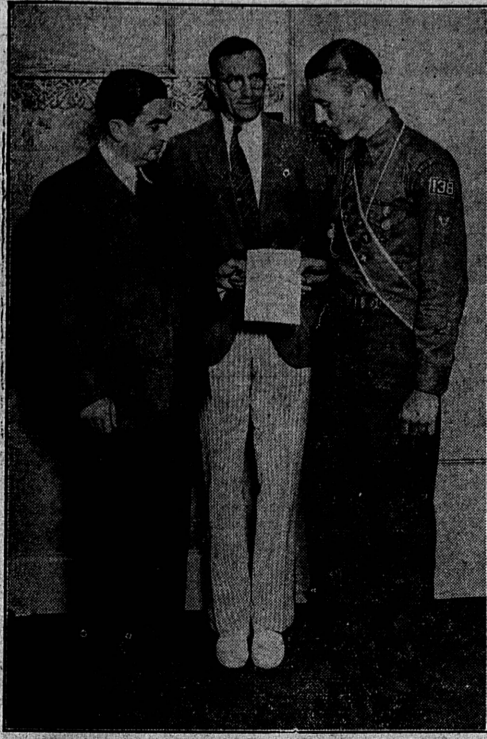


Boy Scouts to Aid In Campaign For 'Home Safety' During Summer

The greatest anti-crime campaign ever staged in Los Angeles county will be launched next week. Aided by an army of 16,000 Boy Scouts of America, Sheriff Eugene Biscailuz and Chief of Police James E. Davis, of the Los Angeles police department, will conduct a "Home Safety Week" drive throughout the city and county.

Throughout the week of May 28-June 2, the vast army of Scouts will visit 700,000 homes in furthering the movement. "With the advent of summer vacations it was decided something should be done to warn citizens against burglaries during their absence from the homes," Sheriff Biscailuz stated.

Plans for the "Home Safety Week" campaign won instant support from Chief of Police Davis. He said:

"Citizens who follow the suggestions contained in the circular will not only benefit themselves, but will manifestly aid law enforcement agencies."

Apprise of the purpose of the drive, Carl Carlson, regional Scout executive, readily agreed to mobilize the Boy Scouts to assist the authorities. The Scouts will be in uniform when they appear at the homes, and the sheriff requests a courteous reception for them.

Civil War Veteran Is Hale And Active At 93

Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Rous, of Redlands, California, were guests last Friday of Mr. Rous' nephew, Irvin C. Rous and family, 1336 Engracia, coming from Long Beach where they had attended the G. A. R. convention.

Mr. Rous senior enlisted at the beginning of the Civil war in an Indiana regiment, his old home, and served until he fell almost mortally wounded on the battlefield at Antietam in 1862. Mr. Rous recounts that experience with a good deal of glee at the error of the stretcher bearers who came on the field to pick up the wounded.

When the bearers came again the next morning, they were astounded to find him still alive, and carried him to the hospital where he lay for many months and finally recovered.

Seventy-two years have passed since that time, and Rous is now 93 years of age, hale and active as many a man years younger than he. He never misses a G. A. R. convention, travels far and wide to attend the meetings where he lives over the old army days with the gray old veterans whose numbers from year to year are dropping so fast.

He proudly wears his medals, given for valor, and among them is the one coveted by every veteran and bestowed upon few, the Order of the Purple Heart. While here, Nephew Irvin took his uncle to attend the carnival at the high school where he was the center of interest among the young people, and where he distinguished himself by tossing a ring over the neck of a duck to win a prize.

Mr. and Mrs. Rous left Saturday to return home to Redlands, where he is commander of the local G. A. R. post and where on May 30 he will deliver Lincoln's Gettysburg address as a part of the program for observance of Memorial Day.

Victim of Truck Accident Brings Suit For Damage

Nellie Barnes of Gardena Alleges "Fear Reaction" After Vehicle Hits Restaurant

When Nellie A. Barnes looked up from her work in a restaurant at 20,000 South Broadway, Gardena, and saw a huge truck in the kitchen the shock was too great for her and she suffered "psychoneurosis and fear reaction on the basis of a conditioned reflex," according to the complaint of herself and husband, Chas. N. Barnes, on file today in Los Angeles county superior court.

The Barnes ask a total of \$10,000 for personal injuries and damage to their restaurant. According to the complaint, two trucks, one driven by H. C. Wood, and another by H. V. Belden, collided in front of the eating place last December 27, one of them running through the front of the restaurant and on into the kitchen.

Besides the two drivers, the Cantlay and Tanzola, Inc. and the Sterling Truck and Trailing Company, are named defendants as owners of the trucks. Of the amount asked \$500 is for medical expenses.
