Purchaser of Used Cars Are Given Warning

Purchasers of used cars from other than an authorized dealer are requested by this department of motor vehicles to be sure that the car has been properly transferred into the name of the person offering it for sale, and to see that the number on the motor corresponds with that shown on the pink or white slip. Many cases of illegal transfer have occurred recently, which might be avoided by the use of a little caution on the part of the purchaser. The department also warns all persons to notify the motor vehicle division within ten days of the purchase and to have the transfer into their own name made at once. Persons who have private garages for rent are notified that they must report the rental immediately to the city police department.

ZAMPERINI ANNEXES STATE RECORD AT BERKELEY MEET

Undefeated Torrance Miller Adds Another Title to His Well Rounded Collection; Runs Last Lap in 55.8 After Slow Start

Louis Zamperini added the state record for the mile to his collection when he won last Saturday at Berkeley in 4:27.8, clipping 1.4 seconds off the mark held by Virgil Hooper of Antelope Valley, twice state champion.

According to those who went from Torrance to attend the meet, Louis ran a great race, although his time in this event was several seconds slower than his sensational mark of the preceding Saturday when he set a new world's record. Louis was twice knocked out of his stride in the first lap, when others of the 16 runners in the event, closely packed on the start, bumped him. He was spiked above the knee in the first 100 yards, and lost ground, but recovered and moved back into his place.

On account of the big list of runners, all of them fast men, the athletes were bunched in the first three laps which were run off in the very slow time of 8:32. Mercer of Hoover (Glendale) set the pace and lead the field until the final round when Louis swung wide the Glendale miler. He ran the last lap in 55.8, the fastest last lap that has been recorded in any meet this year or perhaps many years.

Mercer was eight yards behind at the finish, with Mounday, Negro athlete of Jefferson high, third. Hooper, who was still suffering from a boil on his neck, finished in eighth place. Louis's five points put Torrance high school in tie for 13th place in a field of 62 schools.

Southern California athletes dominated the meet with the five-man colored team from Muir Tech beating out Manual Arts by half a point to win the state championship.

All visiting contestants and their attendants were entertained at U. C. during their stay. Cars met the train at Oakland and the visitors were taken to the university campus where they were lodged in one of the leading fraternity houses and entertained Saturday evening at dinner.

Coch Bernard J. Donahue, Robert Lewellen and Pete Zamperini accompanied Louis Zamperini to Berkeley, where Donahue received many congratulations on the showing of his prize athlete. The Torrance Chamber of Commerce furnished the funds for Louis's trip, under the ruling of the board of education that all Los Angeles high school contestants must pay their own expenses, and the money was well spent in view of the fact that Torrance's only entry provided the principal interest of the meet and came home still undefeated with a new record and a new title.

The Zamperini brothers, Pete and Louis, were the center of attraction at this meet. Pete is well known through having twice competed in the north, and is himself a great miler. It is largely due to Pete's coaching and constant supervision of Louis's training that his young brother has mounted to the heights of fame as the world's best high school distance runner.

Dartmouth Cup Now Permanent Narbonne Trophy
