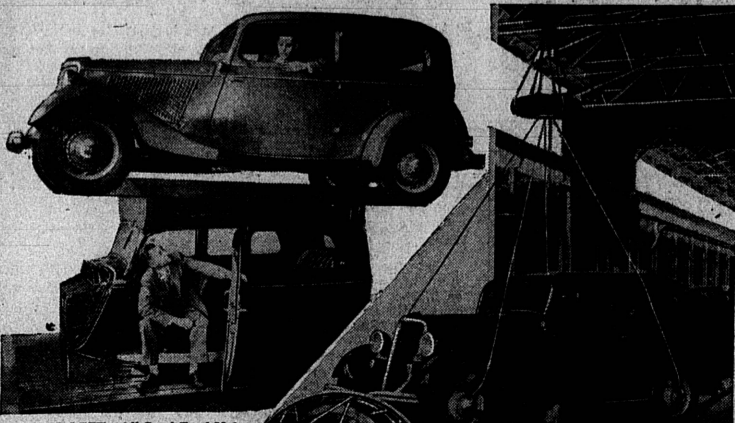

## Show Strength of Ford V-8 Steel Bodies

Two unusual displays to demonstrate the strength of Ford V-8 automobile bodies and the extra safety factor built into the Ford one-piece steel-spoke wheels have been set up for dealers in Southern California, according to Schultz & Peckham, local Ford dealer.

Shown in the upper left is a standard Ford V-8 coach with driver placed on top of the all-steel body of the same model. The weight is in excess of 2600 pounds yet there is not the slightest spring to the upper body. The main in the lower body is open and shut the door as though there were no weight on it.

The average person is inclined to judge the strength of an automobile wheel by the load it will support in its natural running, actually one of the greatest strains to which a wheel is subjected is when a car side-slids into a curb. All of us have seen accidents of this kind in which wheels have collapsed.

"The possibility of such an accident with a Ford V-8 is very remote because all of these cars are equipped with one-piece steel-spoke wheels.

"In its natural running position the wheel never has to support more than the weight of the car—say a ton or two. The strain is hardly anything compared to the strain which a wheel must sustain sideways when rounding a corner at high speed. At 65 or 70 miles an hour on a sharp corner this strain can run as much as five times as high in tons as the weight of the car, because on a corner you must add, to the weight of the car, its momentum."

One of the wheels was fastened to the ceiling in a horizontal position, and from the center, or hub section, was suspended a Ford V-8 sedan with five men in it. This weighed in excess of a ton and a half. This demonstration placed on the spokes the same strain as when a car sways, or skids sideways, against a curb. Few automobile wheels of other types could support so great a weight in a like demonstration.
