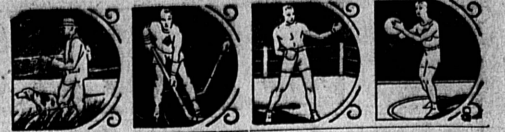

NEVA FAILS TO SHOW FOR TUESDAY GAME; BIRDS LOSE

Fullerton Smacks Hal Forney's Offerings High, Wide and Handsome to Emerge On Long End of 11-4 Score; Louie Expected Back Tomorrow

The Torrance Bluebirds tightened their hold on first place in the National night loop Friday night by defeating Santa Ana with whom they were tied, 6-5, in 14 innings. What little advantage they gained there, they lost Tuesday night when Fullerton smacked them down, 11-4.

Loss of the game was due to the failure of Louie Neva to get back from a trip out of town in time for the game. Louie wired Spud that he would be unable to play, but the wire was delivered too late in the afternoon to allow Spud to reach Pete Hargis who is playing with a San Pedro team. Spud was forced to put Hal Forney in to pitch against the Fullerton boys who were not slow to take advantage of the break.

Hal, U. S. C. ace hard ball pitcher, is just a good average chucker in the night ball game and while he is good enough for the average team he is not heavy enough to go against the artillery of the night loop teams. Spud says that Louie will be back in plenty of time for the game tomorrow night, and if not he will have Hargis on the job.

Anaheim comes here tomorrow night and the Birds will have to take this game if they want to stay in the running for the championship. The loss of Tuesday night's game is a serious blow, as competition is so keen among six out of the eight teams that one little slip spells ruin for the contenders.


