**Three Little Pigs Ballet Plays Shrine Auditorium Aug. 22**

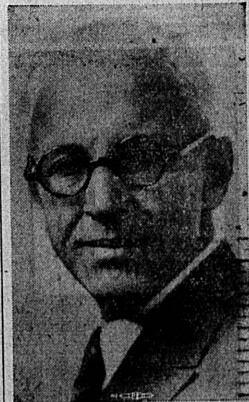

**Lomita Lighting District Asks For Substantial Sum**

What it will cost to provide maintenance for some of the local special districts for 1934-35 is gleaned from the preliminary budget upon which the board of supervisors is holding hearings this week at the Hall of Records in Los Angeles.

The Lomita lighting district will require \$10,750 for maintenance and operation during the year, it is shown.

The Dominguez City lighting maintenance district will require \$8550 for maintenance and operation for the year ending next June 30.

The Moneta lighting district has asked the supervisors to fix a tax rate that will produce \$2155 for maintenance and operation during the year.
