### Entrance Exams At Compton J. C. Next Saturday

All Torrance Students Who Wish to Enroll Must Take Tests

High school graduates in Torrance who plan to enter Compton Junior College are expected to take their entrance examination on Saturday, September 1, at the junior college, according to an announcement made today by school officials. The first semester of instruction will open on September 11 and 12. Those Torrance students who graduated from high school last June will register on Wednesday, September 12. The entrance examination, which is given for the purpose of assisting students in planning their courses, begins at 9 o'clock in the morning and will be completed by noon of that day.

A number of students in this vicinity attend Compton each year, enrolling for many different types of courses. The junior college offers them an opportunity to complete their education with a two-year finishing course in a wide variety of fields preparatory to entering a vocation, such as secretarial training, automotive mechanics, electricity, printing and machine shop. The college also offers an opportunity for those high school graduates whose high school record will not permit them to enter four-year colleges to make up high school deficiencies and to qualify for university entrance with little or no loss of time. The junior college offers the first two years of standard college work in many fields including letters and science, pre-law, pre-engineering, pre-medical, pre-nursing and pre-teaching.

Returning second-year students, who will register on Tuesday, September 11, will be confronted by an ever-changing offering of courses than in previous years. Among the new courses which will be offered for the first time in 1934-1935 are a course in applied psychology, applied economics, fine arts, publicity and public relations, physical science, survey and social psychology.

Preliminary registrations indicate that there will be a marked increase in enrollment the coming year and students are advised to make arrangements for admission before the date of registration.
