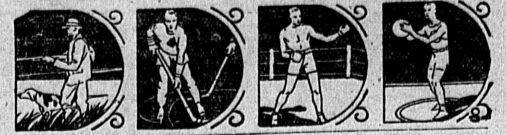

Ascot Speedway Plans Champion 100-Mile Event

Manager Going East to Secure Consent of A.A.A. Officials

Formulating plans for a comprehensive 1934 season, Ed Austin, manager of Ascot speedway, today created a stir in auto racing ranks when he announced plans for an airplane trip to Washington, D. C., early next month to confer with Eddie Rickenbacker, chairman of the American Automobile Association. It is Austin's aim to induce Rickenbacker to sanction a national 100-mile dirt track championship event at the Los Angeles course in October.

"At the present time there is no championship rating for drivers on half-mile tracks," said Austin. "It is our plan to make Ascot the capital of the dirt track game in the United States."

The A. A. A. now sanctions only sectional championships with titles at stake in the eastern, mid-western, and Pacific coast circuits. Johnny Hannon leads the eastern field for 1934, while "Doc" McKenzie is the contender in the mid-west and Rex Mays the dominant figure on the Pacific coast.

"We intend to bring all the champions and near-champions together for a half-mile classic that will be a real prize event," Austin jumped out of the Lake Erie into the annual stock car race at Elgin."
