Mrs. Haggard sends a glowing account of the convention which was attended by thousands of florists from all parts of the country, and from whose sessions all derived valuable pointers on floral work and style interpretations.

The high light of the convention was a huge public fashion show at which fall and winter styles in gowns and flowers were introduced by internationally famous clothing and flower stylists.

The general trend of the messages received indicates that: Gentlemen will again send flowers to ladies for all occasions; fresh flowers will be worn for all occasions; women will wear wreaths and bandeaus of flowers in their hair; wearing of boutonnières by men has been revived; large mixed flower corsages are to be worn at the waistline; clusters of white camellias on black jackets and coat collars are being worn.

SERA Will Issue Canned Meat To Needy Families

Contracts Awarded to Twelve Packing Plants For Preparation of Supply

Needy families in this community will have canned meat on their bill of fare this winter, the Los Angeles county SERA office was informed today. Contracts have been awarded from state SERA headquarters in San Francisco to twelve California meat processing plants for canning of beef to be slaughtered as the result of drought conditions in the state.

Six of the 12 contracts were given Los Angeles firms—The Globe Packing Company, Golden Packing Company, Sterling Meat Company, Torrea Packing Company and the Union Packing Company. The 12 plants have a combined capacity of 950 head per day, according to W. B. Jenkins, SERA drought director, who pointed out that approximately 30,000 head of cattle on the drought areas will be processed.

The SERA, acting as agent for the Federal Surplus Relief Corporation, has responsibility for the acceptance of cattle at points of shipment, slaughtering, processing and distribution of the meat to families on relief. The processing will be under inspection furnished by the division of animal husbandry of the state department of agriculture.
