Jailed for "Slow Pay"

QUINCY, Mass. (U.P.)—Herman Schatz is in jail, working it out at 50 cents a day, because a district court found him "slow pay." Fined \$65 for bootlegging in May, 1933, it developed recently that under the installment plan granted in his case he had paid only \$4.

DEBBAH, Mass. (U.P.)—March is the "safest" wedding month if you want your marriage to "take," it was indicated by a study of 200 divorce cases filed here. The number of June marriages ending in divorce was almost three times that for any other month.

Hints For Motorists

(The Herald today presents another of a series of instructive articles, based on recent court decisions concerning motor vehicle operation in California, as prepared by Ivan Kelso, Automobile Club of Southern California General Counsel.)

Does a motor vehicle have the right-of-way over a pedestrian between street intersections is a question which often arises. Section 131 1/2 of the California Vehicle Act answers this question. A pedestrian has the right-of-way at marked crosswalks or at unmarked crosswalks which are situated at the end of a block or at intersections where traffic is being controlled by mechanical signals or police officers. At such latter intersections the pedestrian is subject to the direction of such signals or officers.

At places other than marked or unmarked crosswalks, particularly between intersections, pedestrians must yield the right-of-way to motor vehicles. A recent appellate court decision was concerned with an accident that happened on a four-lane highway over which the plaintiff, a pedestrian, tried to cross between intersections where no marked crosswalk existed.

The court said: "While a pedestrian is not precluded from recovering by reason of the fact that he was crossing the highway between intersections, he must exercise reasonable care for his own safety, and where the crossing is made between intersections greater care must be observed than when using an established crossing, and if he falls in the exercise of such care and thereby contributes to the cause of the injury he has no ground for complaint."

The trial court in this action found the plaintiff guilty of contributory negligence in trying to cross the highway between intersections where no marked crosswalk was maintained, and awarded the plaintiff a judgment. The action of the trial court was affirmed by the appellate court. These decisions emphasize the necessity for pedestrians to yield the right-of-way to vehicles between intersections, unless the crossing is made at a marked crosswalk.

Tuesday Program At Motospeedway Host of Surprises

Kenny Scholfield, Hollywood's chum to short track motorcycle racing—Lauras—picked as the "man to beat" Tuesday night, September 25, at Motospeedway, the highly popular speed platter on Long Beach boulevard, one mile south of Compton where thrills galore are dashed up for fans every Tuesday night.

Scholfield, latest rider to attain scratch ranking, has been burning up every track on the Pacific coast. At Sacramento this week he won six trophies, capturing every race he entered.

Charlie Moist, stadium matchmaker, is arranging an altered program for Tuesday and the deviations will be up for the approval of the fans. Many changes from the usual run of events are contemplated, and to say that the fans will be in for a host of sensational surprises is putting it mildly.

Motorcycling is now the only motorcycle track operating in its district, the Atlantic boulevard speedway having closed its doors Thursday night. Increased attendance might be positive for the remainder of the season, in the opinion of General Manager J. A. Crane.
