

### New Singing Star Hailed As the "Musical Comedy Cagney"

Guy Robertson, famous New York musical comedy star, will make his picture debut here tonight when "King Kelly of the U. S. A." opens for a three-day run at the Torrance Theatre.

### New Comedy Lloyd's Best, Says His Wife

Harold Lloyd's severest and best picture critic is his own wife, Mildred Davis Lloyd. Before anyone else ever gets a look at his picture on its first assembly, the comedian always calls in Mrs. Lloyd for an opinion. The custom was not changed in the instance of "The Cat's Paw," produced by the comedian from Clarence Budington Kelland's novel of the same name, and shown tomorrow and Saturday, October 5 and 6, at the Plaza Theatre in Hawthorne. Mrs. Lloyd's verdict was eagerly awaited by the entire company, inasmuch as the picture is a radical departure from anything the comedian has filmed. The answer was not long in forthcoming. "It has opened up an entirely new field for you," was Mrs. Lloyd's first comment to the comedian. "It takes you out of the routine of gag comedy, and

puts you in a position to produce from the works of some of our great comedy writers. I honestly think it is your best picture since "Grandma's Boy."
