

### Delinquent Tax Payment Hits High Figure For Year

Delinquent tax payments for the first four months of 1934 are more than \$500,000 ahead of payments for the similar period of 1933, according to T. E. Tanner, chief clerk of the tax redemption division of the county auditor's office.

Payments for October totaled \$89,487, as against \$477,128 for last September. Payments for October, 1933, were \$580,034, but for September, 1933, were \$872,749.

Tanner accounted for the large payments in September of last year by pointing out that the 60-day moratorium was in effect on tax payment deadlines a year ago, and it affected delinquent collections.

Until April, 1935, property may be redeemed from tax sales without penalties. Interest, however, will be charged at the rate of 7 per cent per annum, computed from July 1, 1934. For those unable to redeem in full, a partial payment plan is provided, allowing payments to be extended over a 10-year period, Tanner pointed out.

Coackley, electrician, has been given instructions to make these trees the finest in the Southland, and no pains or expense will be spared in making them outstanding. Hugo Schmidt, pioneer meat dealer, has volunteered to defray the light bill for the tree at the postoffice.

Finances are being taken care of through individual donations. Containers will be set out in every store and place of business where those who wish to contribute may do so. Fraternal organizations are also taking part in raising funds, and the group which turns over the most money will receive a prize of \$10 in cash.
