THAT THANKSGIVING DINNER

Are you wondering what to serve this year that would be a slight departure from the usual Thanksgiving dinner, yet in keeping with the day? Well, here's a dinner that observes the Thanksgiving traditions according to the Puritan conception, but with a few modern interpretations:

- Cranberry Cocktail
- Roast Turkey
- Browned Rice and Raisin Stuffing
- Giblet Gravy
- Sweet Potato Pie
- Creamed Onions
- Cranberry Sauce
- Watermelon Pickles
- Chiffon Pumpkin Pie
- Coffee
- Mints

I hardly know which recipe to give you since it is impossible to give you all of them. Here's the cocktail recipe, however:

Cranberry Cocktail
Sharpen's Appetite
4 cups cranberries
4 cups water
2-3 cup granulated sugar
Cook cranberries and water until all the skins pop open (about five minutes). Strain through cheesecloth. Bring the juice to boiling point, add sugar, and boil

for two minutes. Serve cold. Other fruit juices or beverages may be added to taste.

The Browned Rice and Raisin Stuffing is simply wonderful—it has an irresistible flavor and you'll want to serve the Sweet Potato Pie often. The prize recipe of the whole menu, however, is "Chiffon Pumpkin Pie," which is made as follows:

Pumpkin Chiffon Pie
(One 9-inch pie)

- 1 envelope Knox sparkling gelatine
- 1/4 cup cold water
- 1 1/2 cups canned pumpkin
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/4 teaspoonful ginger
- 1/4 teaspoonful nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoonful cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoonful salt
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 eggs

To slightly beaten egg yolks add one-half cup sugar, pumpkin, milk, salt and spices. Cook until thick in double boiler. Pour cold water in bowl and sprinkle gelatine on top of water. Add to hot pumpkin mixture, mix thoroughly and cool. When it begins to thicken, add remaining sugar and fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into previously baked pie shell. Chill in refrigerator or cold place. Pie may be garnished with whipped cream just before serving. Delicious served in ginger snap crust (make same as Graham cracker crust, but use a little less sugar).

CHIFFON THOROUGHLY and pour in pumpkin mixture.

Ford To Produce Million Cars To Aid Prosperity

Plant Manager at Long Beach Disclosed Plans in Talk To Schultz & Peckham

"Ford dealers throughout the country are optimistic over the prospects for the coming year, when the Ford Motor Company is to produce one million cars and trucks," said Ira B. Groves, branch manager of the Ford Motor Company, at Long Beach yesterday, in a personal talk with George Peckham and Charles Schultz, local Ford dealers. Mr. Groves last week returned from a branch managers' meeting at Dearborn, Michigan, headquarters of the company.

"Four years have passed since the Ford Motor Company had a production of one million units. However, Henry Ford said when asked about his 1935 production: 'Make it one million or better. Our experience during the past six months and what we see in the future, tells us a year of improved business is ahead.'

Clinic Work Of County Health Dept. Gaining

Increase of 731 Percent Shown Over a Period Five Years

An increase of 731 per cent in the clinic work of the bureau of communicable disease control of the county health department during the last five years is disclosed in the report of this department on file with the board of supervisors.

The greatest yearly increase in the work of this bureau was during the fiscal year 1933-34, the report states. "There was an increase of 10,000 visits of patients over the previous year. In the health districts of the county there were 30,386 patients visits during 1932-33 and 40,381 during 1933-34.

"This great increase in work during the past fiscal year was taken care of without increase in staff," the report states, and continues: "The one full-time physician in charge of the division found it necessary to devote his entire time to clinic work and during the five working days he conducted ten heavy clinics distributed over the county area from Pomona on the east to Torrance and Inglewood on the west and from Compton on the south to San Fernando in the north. Intermediate points being Alhambra, El Monte, Marvella Park and Huntington Park where it was necessary to hold two clinics a week."

Of the remaining eight clinics, according to the report, Whittier and West Hollywood were conducted by local district physicians and the others were conducted by part-time physicians.

"Not only Ford dealers," continued Mr. Groves, "but men handling practically every other make of automobiles are elated over Ford's reassuring statement. The general opinion is that if Ford will build one million cars in 1935 business will be good for other manufacturers and their dealers."

"Proving that Ford's announcement of a projected million-year for 1935 is more than an optimistic statement, Ford dealers throughout the country point to the fact that for several weeks commitments have been going out from Ford headquarters at Dearborn on a buying and production program that will entail a total expenditure of more than 415 million dollars. This vast amount is to be spent among 6000 suppliers scattered throughout the United States.

"It is estimated that when the drive to produce one million cars is in full swing 87,000,000 men will be employed in the Ford industrial army. The Ford monthly payroll in the Detroit area alone will run over \$6,861,000.

"The Ford 1935 project calls for spending tremendous sums. For instance, it is estimated that the bringing in of raw materials will require 164,000 freight cars and outgoing products will require 160,000 freight cars, involving pay-

ment of freight bills, largely to the railroads, of \$74,000,000.

"One of the large expenditures of major importance," concluded Mr. Groves, "will be for non-ferrous metals. In addition to the steel made in the Ford mills, the sum of \$53,000,000 will go for steel in the open market.
